Memorial Day 2018

At the end of our march, the community gathered at the Greenlawn Memorial for the Memorial Ceremony conducted by the Greenlawn Fire Department.

After the presentation of wreaths, a rifle volley and the playing of "Taps," Legionnaire and Firefighter SFC Al Statton, US Army (Ret), stepped forward to make a very special presentation to the members of the Greenlawn Fire Department.

Statton had framed both a National Defense Medal to honor all those firefighters who are or were veterans and a Purple Heart Medal to honor all military veteran firefighters who have suffered wounds or given their lives in defense of our nation.

The Purple Heart represented Mathew Scott Jr. a Greenlawn firefighter and WWII B17 tail gunner who was fatally wounded in 1944.

Service Officer Report - "You Earned It!"

Rapid Appeals Modernization Program (RAMP)

A new program that the VA rolled out in November, 2017 called the "RAMP" Program is a new law created to give you three different ways for you to appeal the VA's decision on your disability claim. The goal is to decrease the time your claim is spent in the appeals process.

Initially, you could only participate by invitation only. However, as of April 2, 2018, all veterans can sign up for this program.

Basically, the VA is saying that if you switch, you will get a faster decision. And that under the RAMP program a decision on an appeal will be made in 30 - 120 days. Sounds too good to be true. We'll just have to wait and see.

Should You Switch?

You should consult with an accredited Veterans Service Officer to be sure that it is advantageous to your case before making any decision. In some cases, you'll get a quicker decision, but it may be a rubber stamp of a previous denial. It pays to have your ducks in a row and get a professional opinion before you submit anything to the VA!

We will be following this closely, and will let you know when there are any further developments.

Missing In America Project

PVT I Matthew McCall, US Army Calverton National Cemetery March 27, 2018

The VFW of East Rockaway came in a bus with a contingent of their Post, the Patchogue Post came, other veterans from around Long Island came as well as some Auxiliary ladies. A Riverhead town councilwoman came. At least fifty veterans and a number of civilians showed up for the interment of this one veteran, Matthew McCall. This has never happened for one veteran before. It is our fervent wish that this continues.

As of late, New York City's Mayor's Office of Veteran Affairs has been sending MIAP a greater number of African American veterans than normal. This is coincidental with American Legion Post 1244's decision to support and aid Post 1218, an all African American Post, in their new endeavor. The post has been having a renaissance reestablishing their post to their prior stature in the community.

Consequently MIAP and Post 1244 decided to strength-

en the diversity within the Suffolk County American Legion. It is MIAP, as well as the Suffolk County American Legion and Post 1244 that have extended themselves.

MIAP has invited Post 1218 to receive the burial flags of the African American Veterans who are unclaimed and brought to us for a proper burial. Post 1218 Commander Lenore Brathwaite and 1st Vice Commander Harry Legette accepted the last three flags that have come from MIAP.

We hope and pray that our support will help increase their solidarity as a Post and strengthen MIAP's mission, the Suffolk County American Legion's initiatives, and Post 1244's effectiveness. Doing the right thing will always hold us in good stead.

Sgt. Malzetta D. Hanberry, US Army Calverton National Cemetery April 26, 2018

Approximately 40 attendees witnessed the interment of 87 year old Sgt. Malzetta Delores Hanberry, who served honorably in the United States Army between 1950 and 1954. The attendees included patriots from several American Legion Posts, various motorcycle rider groups and members of the Northport, NY VA Medical Center.

American Legion Post 1244 Rider Chaplain, Mike Williams, opened the ceremony with a heartfelt invocation. Following a rendition of "Taps," the Army Honor Guard folded and presented Veteran Hanberry's casket flag to veteran Denise M. Buggs-Williams in recognition of her service as a Certified Peer Support Specialist at the VA Medical Center in Northport, N.Y.

I offered a eulogy for Veteran Hanberry and included the poem "Because That's What We Do," dedicated to the 40 attendees, who took time out of their day, to honor one of their own.

Chaplain Williams closed our ceremony by offering an original benediction. John Caldarelli, MIAP National Representative, then took a minute to thank the members of the American Legion Greenlawn Post 1244 MIAP team for their efforts on behalf of our forgotten Veterans. Finally,

SailAhead - Healing Wounded Veterans Through Sailing



It was 4 years ago on a beach in Oyster Bay when Sail-Ahead met the members of Greenlawn American Legion Post 1244, a meeting that would lead to a partnership and a partnership that would lead to a friendship. Sail-

Ahead today has come a long way from that snowy beach in Oyster Bay.

Today, the SailAhead fleet is much larger, and firm partnerships have been established with a wide variety of organizations, from the Local VA to the Tacoma Yacht club in Washington State. This year SailAhead joined the United War Veterans Council, which is a confederation of veteran service organizations within the tristate area working for the good of veterans near and far. The council was established as a way to link many VSOs together in the hopes that mutually beneficial partnerships can form and grow. A meeting was held at the New York Stock Exchange this winter to talk about how to make the best difference in the veteran's community, it was a great opportunity and shows great promise for the positive impacts that are coming.

As an example, SailAhead connected with the Yaphank homeless shelter, which has driven dozens of homeless veterans to many SailAhead events throughout the years, and promised that many more veterans would come.

This year SailAhead plans to do everything they've done last year, big and small, but with the addition of a few

events and programs. The largest event of the year will be the "Let's Take a Veteran Sailing" event at Centerport Yacht Club, and with the continuing support of Post 1244, it will be the 4th year we host this event, and yet another complete success. The smallest scale activities are arguably our more important programs. Weekly sails aboard Stargazer (SailAhead's flagship of 38 feet) will be set in place in order to heal veterans and expose them to the maritime world. These weekly sails can be therapeutic, educational and create lasting friendships.

In July, SailAhead will have its second annual sailing event in Tacoma Washington, where the vast majority of the guests are US Army Rangers, some of the most highly trained soldiers in the world. That event is designed to take veterans and active duty members of the US armed forces out sailing as a token of appreciation. But it also spreads awareness. Like all of our events, our Washington event serves as a way to spread the word about SailAhead, and about PTSD and depression. It is also a memorial to Ryan James Day, a former Ranger in the 75th regiment 2nd battalion. He was stationed in Tacoma Washington when he took his life in the winter of 2014.

This year alone, SailAhead is expected to take around 300 veterans out on the water! It's not easy work, but with loyal and supportive partners like the Greenlawn American Legion, countless veterans will have the opportunity to sail and experience healing on the water.

American Legion Greenlawn Post 1244 is proud to have partnered with SailAhead since 2015, helping to spread awareness of veteran suicide, honor the victims of suicide and their surviving families and offer healing experiences to veterans suffering from PTSD.

The team is a 501(c)(3) public charity whose mission is to inspire and educate others while enhancing the health and welfare of Wounded Warrior Amputees. The WWAST is comprised of competitive, athletic veterans who have lost limbs while serving their country in the military/war.

On May 20, we joined with other motorcycle organizations in escorting the team from the Raddison Hotel in Hauppague to the Medford Athletic Complex where they were to play the Long Island all Stars.

Upon our arrival at the athletic fields, we were honored to participate in the opening ceremony which was followed by a spirited game against the local Long Island All Stars.

These guys showed great spirit. Not a trace of self pity. They don't consider themselves to be crippled.

In addition to raising funds for their softball program costs, they host an annual Kids Camp where they bring in 20 children (between 8-12 years old) with amputations for a week-long camp where the team members serve as coaches and mentors. The WWAST pays all expenses for the 20 children and one guardian. Their Kids Camp for 2018 will be held in Manchester, NH on June 10-17.

Fallen Patriots Celebration



Our First Annual Fallen Patriots
Celebration was held June 16, 2018 at
St. Joseph Council Knights of

The purpose was to remember all our members who have departed for Post Everlasting. Although our post is 75 years old, our records of their deaths reach back only to 2004. In that time 74 members that we know of have died.

Our ceremony began with an invocation by our event Chaplain, Al Statton. All attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Commander Dennis Madden then welcomed the families of those to be honored as well as all post members in attendance.

After a dedication by Master of Ceremonies Charlie Tritto, we enjoyed a recording and slide show created by Charlie called "Ragged Old Flag." The voice of Johnny Cash reverberated about the room and in every heart. His spoken word tribute to patriotism is as relevant today as when it was recorded more than 40 years ago. Charlie, poet laureate as well as Post 1244 chaplain followed the presentation with his poem "The Fallen Patriots of 1244."

The names of each member who died since August 2004 were read by several members of the post. As each

A Moment With Chaplain Charlie



It was unusually hot in the Bronx that day in July of 1967. A bunch of us had just finished playing stickball and were sitting on a stoop when my buddy turned to me and asked, "You wanna' enlist?" Well, I thought, there was a war going on and besides, I had just completed my first year of college and wasn't looking for-

ward to my second. "Sure," I said "What branch?" He said, "Well, my brother was in the Air Force...." And so, because of a stickball game on a hot summer day, the rest of my life was set in motion. The Lord works in strange ways.

After Basic Training at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas, I spent the next 18 months learning my trade as a Communication Center Specialist with the 1926th Communications Group, Robins Air Force Base, Warner Robins, Georgia.

From Georgia, it was 18 months with the 1961st Communications Group, Clark Air Base, Luzon, the Philippines. Two months before my deployment, I was assigned to the U S Army Southeastern Signal School, Fort Gordon, Georgia, to learn how to operate the new equipment I would be working with at Clark. Needless to say, when I arrived in the Philippines, the equipment was nowhere to be found. Did somebody say "SNAFU?"

I made Sergeant and spent my final year with the 655th Radar Squadron, Watertown Air Force Station, Watertown NY, where, on my off time, I worked as a bartender. Nothing fancy. Served only beer and shots. The pay

was awful, but I learned more about the human condition tending bar, than I ever could have pursuing a PhD.

I was honorably discharged in September of 1971. My Air Force experience landed me a job on Wall Street as a data communications technician. I spent the next 40 plus years working for banks and brokerage houses in various telecommunication and network operations roles.

I met my wife, Diane, a Brooklyn girl, in August of 1972. We were married in the Three Hierarchs Greek Orthodox Church on Avenue P in Brooklyn the following June. Our first apartment was on 95th Ave. in Ozone Park. In 1979, Diane and I, 4 year old Charlie Jr. and 2 year old Christine, moved to our "starter" house in Deer Park. Although our kids have long since moved out, Diane and I still live in that same split we first entered 39 years ago. It makes us wonder where the years went when we see our grandchildren, Jake, 10, and Julia, 7 sleeping and playing in the same rooms our kids did a generation ago.

I retired several years ago and love the freedom it brings. In addition to my volunteer work at the Northport VA Medical Center, I enjoy writing, photography, movie making, target shooting, metal detecting, geocaching, cooking, and of course, making memories with Jake and Julia.

I look forward to serving you as Chaplain of our post. I may be a rookie Chaplain, but I'm a trustworthy listener (remember that bartending I did back in the day?) Let me know if you want to talk....

Operation Enduring Care

The residents of Northport VA Medical Center's Community Living Centers are benefitting from the efforts of Legionnaire Al Statton and the volunteers and donors supporting Operation Enduring Care. OEC was formed to support the homeless veterans and families at the Salvation Army Shelter, and more recently the Beacon House facility. With the shelter undergoing rehabilitation, OEC is now focusing on the needs of the nursing home and palliative care units.


